**CaNOE Quests – First Ocean Literacy in Canada Conference June 17–18, 2015
Sheraton Wall Center, Vancouver, British Columbia**

CaNOE Quest 1 – Maritime Museum & Granville Island Market

\$30. Travel by foot (~2.5km over course of day) & water taxi. Meet at Sheraton Lobby for 8:30 departure.

In Vanier Park, stroll popular, Kitsilano beach, with great views of the city then dive into ocean literacy at the Vancouver Maritime Museum with a focus on exploration and learning. The museum has recently renovated the Children's Maritime Discovery Centre and we meet with educators working with learners on extreme environments and arctic explorers. Next we head for the wonderful Granville Island Market where we get up close and personal with lunch before launching into an expert-led session on sustainable seafood.

While we explore, experienced Tsleil-Waututh Nation guides will share legends, songs, and stories that will help you to create memories that will last a lifetime. On return we meet with the media (optional) at Crab Park to celebrate ocean literacy success stories and to celebrate the ocean. Other CaNOE Quest groups will also arrive on our return.
