- Oral and poster presentations will be scheduled within the appropriate symposium subthemes:
  - 1. Ocean Literacy and Culture

  - 4. Stewardship and Advocacy for Ocean Literacy
- Oral and poster presentations should focus on successes of ocean literacy efforts within these subthemes, how to move forward from these successes, and new innovations within these subthemes.
